A real view of the industry

ITMA Daily News assess the success of ITMA 2023 with Ernesto Maurer, president of the European Committee of Textile Machinery Manufacturers (CEMATEx) and ITMA exhibitors.

Over the last week, we have experienced a ground-breaking, international exhibition here in Milan. It has shown us countless innovations and pushed the industry towards making further steps to sustainable manufacturing, particularly through adopting digitalisation.

For the remainder of the show, exhibitors will continue to showcase their innovations and as we have seen already, visitors will continue to invest in what has been a strong buying show – evidenced across the halls. More than machine purchases, the event has also seen some formidable partnerships form, which is exciting for the future of the industry.

Ernesto Maurer, president of the European Committee of Textile Machinery Manufacturers (CEMATEx), said: "This year's ITMA is a tremendous success. Part of it is because it is the first worldwide show since the Covid-19 pandemic. The industry is going through difficult times and when this happens, people are much more interested in how to make their money work better. Something like ITMA helps them get a real view of the textile industry."

ITMA 2023 highlighted the importance of a digital and sustainable transformation in the textile machinery sector.

In terms of visitors, day one of the event saw a 4% increase on the last exhibition in Barcelona, Spain.

Digitalisation and sustainability were clearly present throughout the halls of this year's exhibition, this is particularly important when it comes to continued innovation in this challenging market.

Maurer said: "These themes have been present in other ways before but this time, with Covid-19, we really had to get it moving. Digitalisation has really moved ahead, there is a much larger demand."

"The industry has taken a huge step ahead with being more digitised. Digitalisation and sustainability are closely linked and in the last eight years, the awareness of the need for sustainability has not just doubled, it has
